FREE TAX PREP OFFERED AT LIBRARY

AARP and the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance programs will be providing free tax preparation assistance for those residents making less than \$55k at seven locations throughout St. Lucie County. The closest location for us is Lakewood Park Branch Library, 7605 Santa Barbara Drive, Fort Pierce. Assistance is offered on Tuesdays,

Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 10:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 9:30 – 11:00 a.m. Bring with you all documents typically required to file your taxes.

RECYCLING WOES

When the recycling program was introduced, there were rules as to what can be recycled and what cannot. Please note the following. 1. We do not do single stream recycling, therefore all recycling must be separated into two different bins. Boxes and paper in one and other recyclables in the other. If the driver finds mixed recycling, he is not authorized to pick it up. 2. Boxes must be cut up to fit inside the issued recycling containers. This does not mean cut up to fit but sticking four feet above the container. The recycling truck cannot take large boxes. They will jam up and damage the machine. If boxes or cut up pieces are too big, the driver will not pick them up. 3. We do not take plastic bags, the recycling center will not accept bagged items. In some cases, the driver will empty the bag into the truck and leave the bag. 4. All items must be recyclable. Chicken bones are not recyclable. If the driver finds regular garbage in the bin, he will not pick it up.
